Max did an exceptional job developing a comprehensive, detail-oriented Medical Plan and coordinating with interagency paramedics, physicians, and medical professionals who supported the World Cup events. He created clear and informative slide decks to ensure staff fully understood the medical response protocols for injured racers. To further enhance preparedness, Max captured drone footage of the entire course—from the Super-G through the finish area—allowing staff to visualize ahead of time exact locations for medical positioning and response.

His communication throughout the planning process was clear, thorough, and well-organized. Max facilitated a Flight for Life helicopter training exercise and conducted small-group meetings with race patrol members to ensure they had the information and confidence needed to perform their roles effectively. He also oversaw other areas of operations with locations for medical tents, ambulance staging areas, helicopter landing zones, etc.

During and ahead of the event, Max set clear expectations and maintained strong communication throughout the races. He approached his responsibilities with professionalism and seriousness, managing a complex and high-stakes ski race with precision. His skill set, initiative, and thoughtful preparation played a critical role in the flawless execution of each event from the Men's Super G to Women's slalom, and the entire team was better prepared because of his efforts.

Add to all of this, Max was an absolute pleasure to work with on this event, and Copper Mountain is fortunate to have Max on their Team!
